#### What just happened?

If you have just made a confession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, believing in your heart that He is the Son of God who came to earth, lived as a man without sin, and died for the sin of mankind, then something miraculous has just happened to you!

Some call it being saved, or being born again, which are both Scriptural terms.

The apostle Paul said in Romans 10:9-10:

<sup>9</sup> that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, **you will be saved**; <sup>10</sup> for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

Jesus said in John 3:7:

<sup>7</sup>Do not be amazed that I said to you, 'You must be **born again**.'

What actually happened is that your spirit, which was dead in sin, has come alive in Christ Jesus. You have passed from death to life, been transferred from the kingdom of darkness into the kingdom of light, and you've been made a new creature in Christ Jesus.

He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life.

Paul said in Colossians 1:13:

<sup>13</sup> For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and **transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son**,

Paul said in 2 Corinthians 5:17:

<sup>17</sup> Therefore **if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature**; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.

#### What's important now?

Just as a newborn baby needs nourishment to stay alive and grow, so do you need spiritual nourishment to feed, breathe and grow spiritually. It's important to continue in the things that will bring about your spiritual growth. It's not something you do one time or occasionally, but growth will come as you begin new and regular habits of **Bible study, prayer,** and **developing relationships with other believers.** Jesus Himself prayed regularly to the Father, and learned the Scriptures even as a child. How much more do we need to do the same!
